

TAYLOR COUNTY VOTERS

2023 Primary Election Information- Election Day is May 16th.

Voters in Taylor County will be able to vote using one of the following options...

1. IN PERSON one of the following three ways:

a. EARLY VOTING at the New Taylor County Fire Department, located at 1563 Greensburg Road, close to light #1, across from the Bowling Alley.

Early Voting will be Thursday May 11th, Friday May 12th, and Saturday May 13th. Times for early voting will be 8:00 am till 4:00 pm each of the three days. Any voter, regardless of where you live in the county, can choose to voter early at the fire department. There is no excuse needed to vote early.

b. In person Excused absentee- Voters who qualifiy to vote absentee in person will be able to vote at the County Clerk's office on May 3rd, 4th, 5th, 8th, 9th and 10th. Contact our office for more info if you think you would qualify to vote absentee in person.

c. ELECTION DAY –Tuesday May 16that your home precinct.

We will be voting in our home precinct on election day like we did during the 2022 Primary and General Elections. All locations are the same locations that were used during the 2022 Primary and General elecitons. A complete list of precincts and their addresses are at the bottom of this notice. All precincts will be open from 6 am till 6 pm on Tuesday May 16th.

2. BY MAIL-Only for those eligible to vote absentee using the state portal at govoteky.com to request your ballot. If you do not have access to a computer, and you qualify to vote absentee by mail, you can call our office at 270-465-6677. **The dates for requesting an absentee/mail in ballot through the portal are April 1st through May 2nd at 11:59 p.m.**

Requirements to vote absentee are:

- *Unable to appear due to age, disability or illness.
- *A member of the Armed Forces confined to a military base.
- *A dependent of a member of the Armed Forces.
- *A student who temporarily resides outside of the county in which they are registered.
- *Temporarily reside outside the state, but are eligible to vote in Kentucky.
- *Person who is incarcerated and charged but not yet convicted of a crime.
- *Person whose employment location requires them to be absent from the county all hours and all days of in-person excused absentee, early voting and on election day.
- *Person qualified under the address confidentiality program with the Secretary of State.
